



it in our Book of memories.

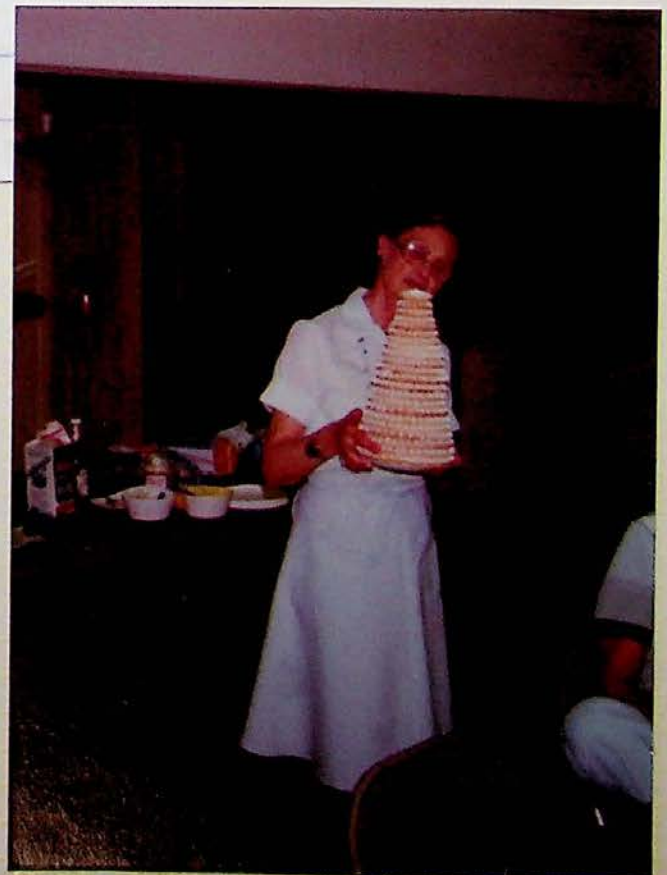
The group gave us a Book on John

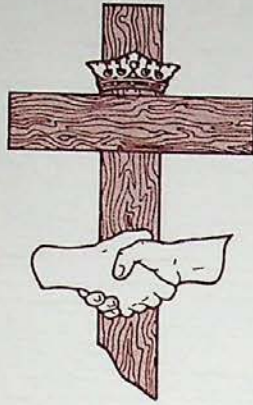
Dear Mother and Dad:

The Lawrence Welk Story

In 1955, Lawrence Welk signed a 13-week national network contract, and "seers" said he "wouldn't last 4 weeks." Today, in his 27th year of national TV, he has his own network of 248 United States and Canadian stations, the largest ever to feature a continuing weekly TV program!

Lawrence, an American tradition in his lifetime, was a farm boy who loved music. For his first "concert," in the Welk barn, he played his \$15 accordion before an audience of chickens, turkeys, pigeons, horses and cows.

At 21, having played name-day events, weddings, picnics and barn dances galore, he left the farm "for fame and fortune." His dad's prediction that he'd soon return, like the prodigal son, proved his lifetime challenge to spur him on to success.

"I had problems a-plenty," he recalls, "but when you're doing something you love, it really isn't work! Actually, those problems taught me how to overcome the problems that came along later.

"I'm grateful for all the folks who helped me over the years, for having such wonderful friends, and for being born an American. Today, my greatest joy is helping talented young people to become full-fledged performers, just as so many folks helped me through the years."

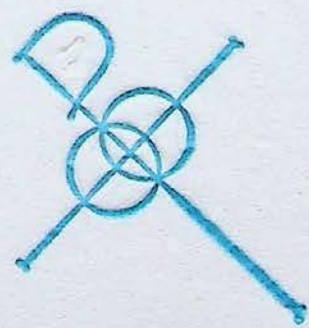

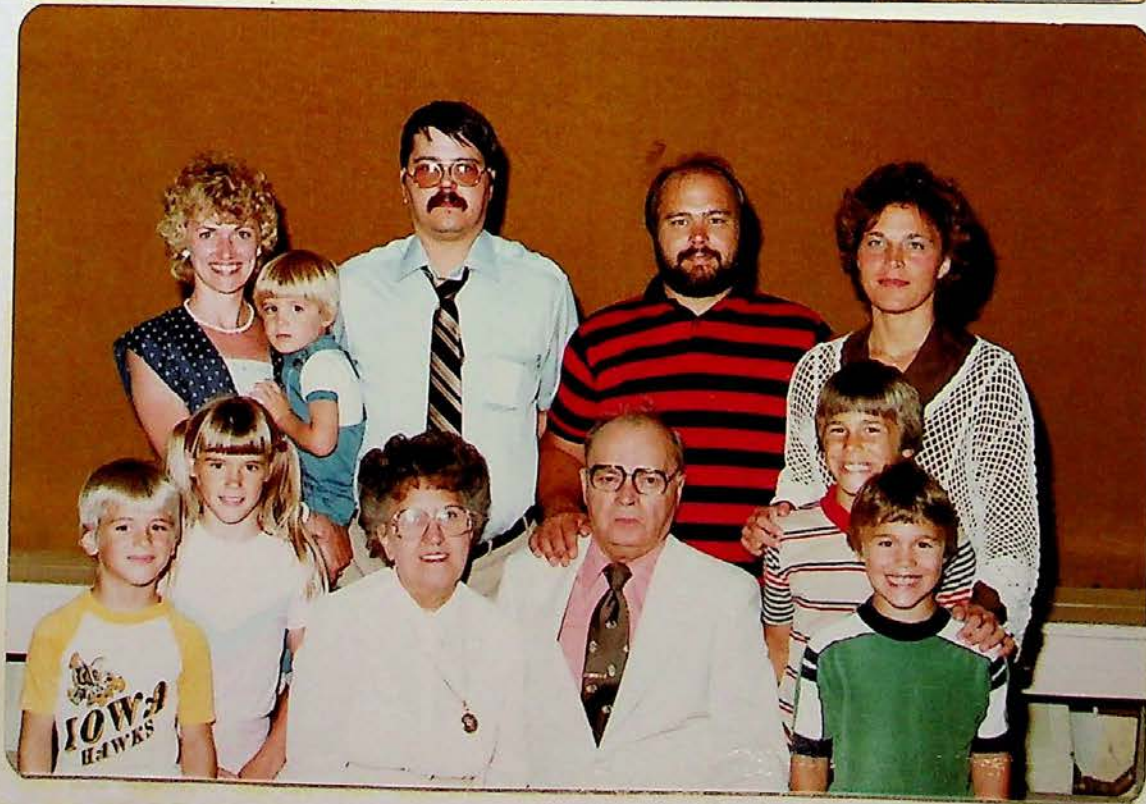

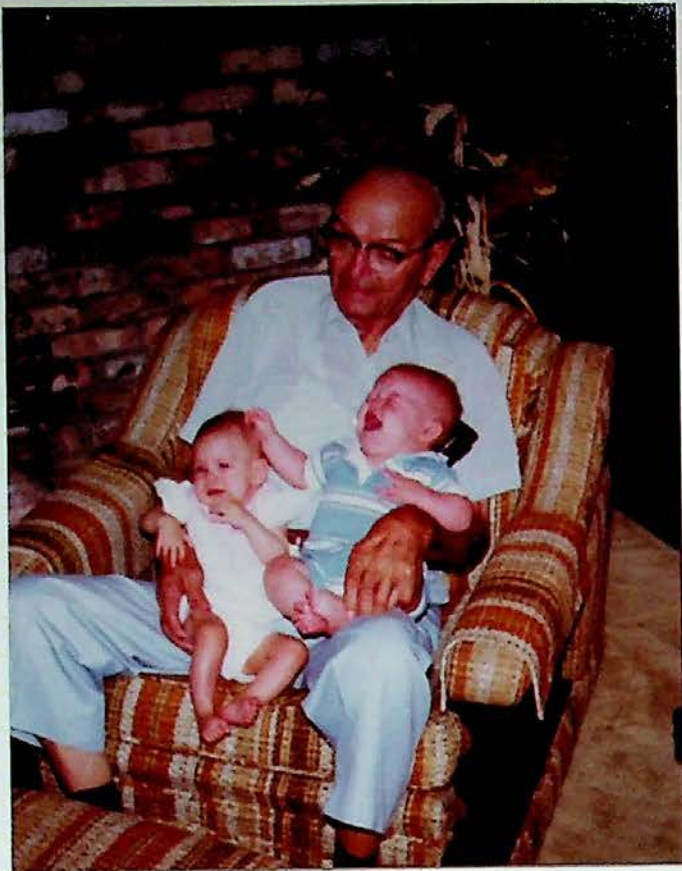
