## Declaration for Widow's Army Pension

STATE OF *Indiana*, } ss:  
County of *Johnson*

On this *27<sup>th</sup>* day of *April*, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and sixty *three*, personally appeared before me *William H. Parnette* Clerk of the Circuit Court within and for the County and State aforesaid, *Lydia Vawter*, a resident of *Franklin*, in the County of *Johnson* and State of *Indiana*, aged *51* years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on her oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, approved July 14, 1862: That she is the widow of *Edmond R. Vawter* who enlisted in the service of the United States at *Indianapolis Indiana* on the *21<sup>st</sup>* day of *February* 1862 as a *private* in Company *"G"*, commanded by in the *35<sup>th</sup>* Regiment of *Indiana Volunteers* in the war of 1861, who died, while in said service at Bowling Green State of Kentucky on the *2<sup>nd</sup>* day of *February* 1863 of disease contracted while in said service.

She further declares that she was married to the said *Edmond R. Vawter* on the *3<sup>rd</sup>* day of *August* in the year *1858*; that her husband, the aforesaid *Edmond R. Vawter* died on the day above mentioned, and that she has remained a widow ever since that period, as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereto annexed; that the names and ages of her children as last seen by her at her husband's decease, and the places their residence is as follows: *That she has no children under the age of fifteen years.*

She also declares that she has not in any manner been engaged in or aided or abetted the rebellion in the United States. She hereby appoints *Overthut Hunter*

of Franklin, County of Johnson, State of  
Indiana, her true and lawful Attorney, with full power of substi-  
tution to prosecute this claim for pension, and to receive the certificate to be issued therefor.
